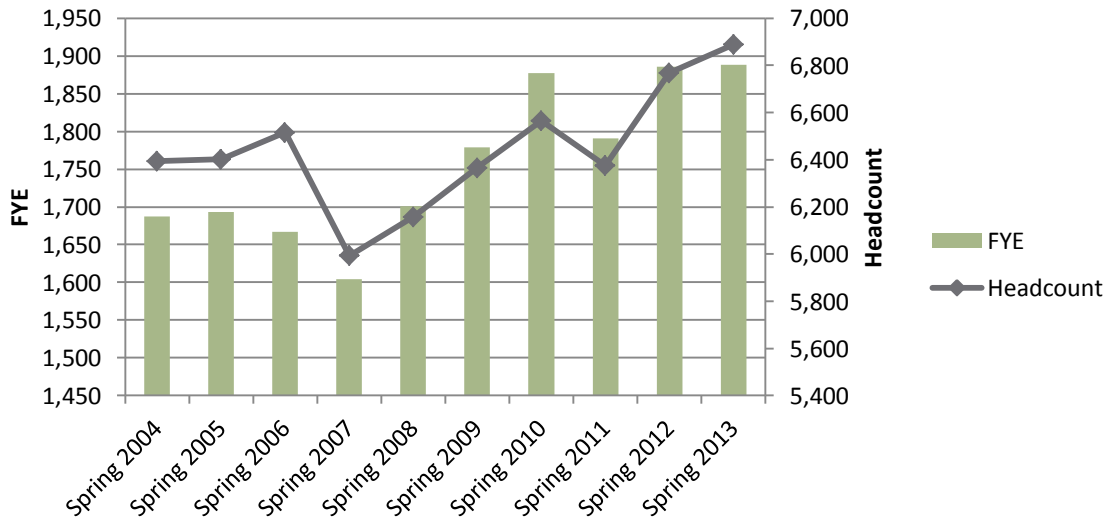

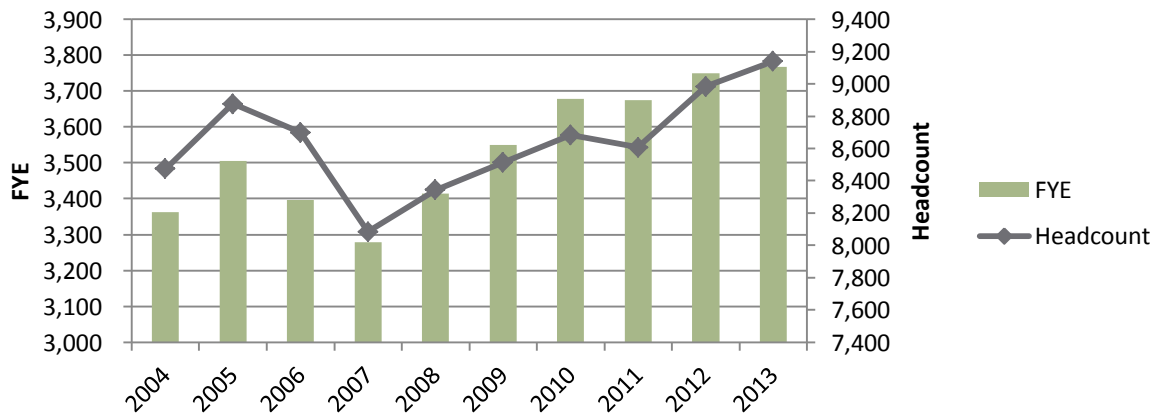

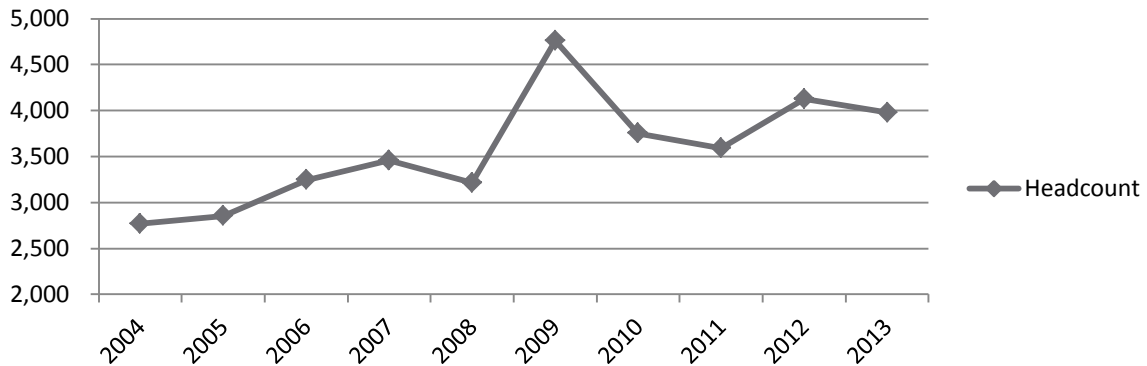

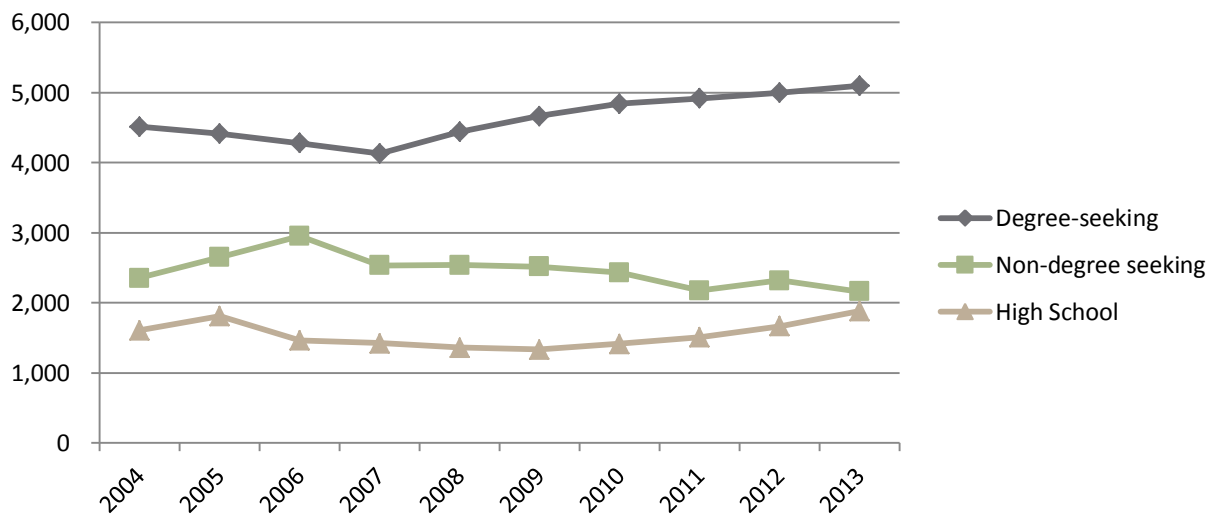

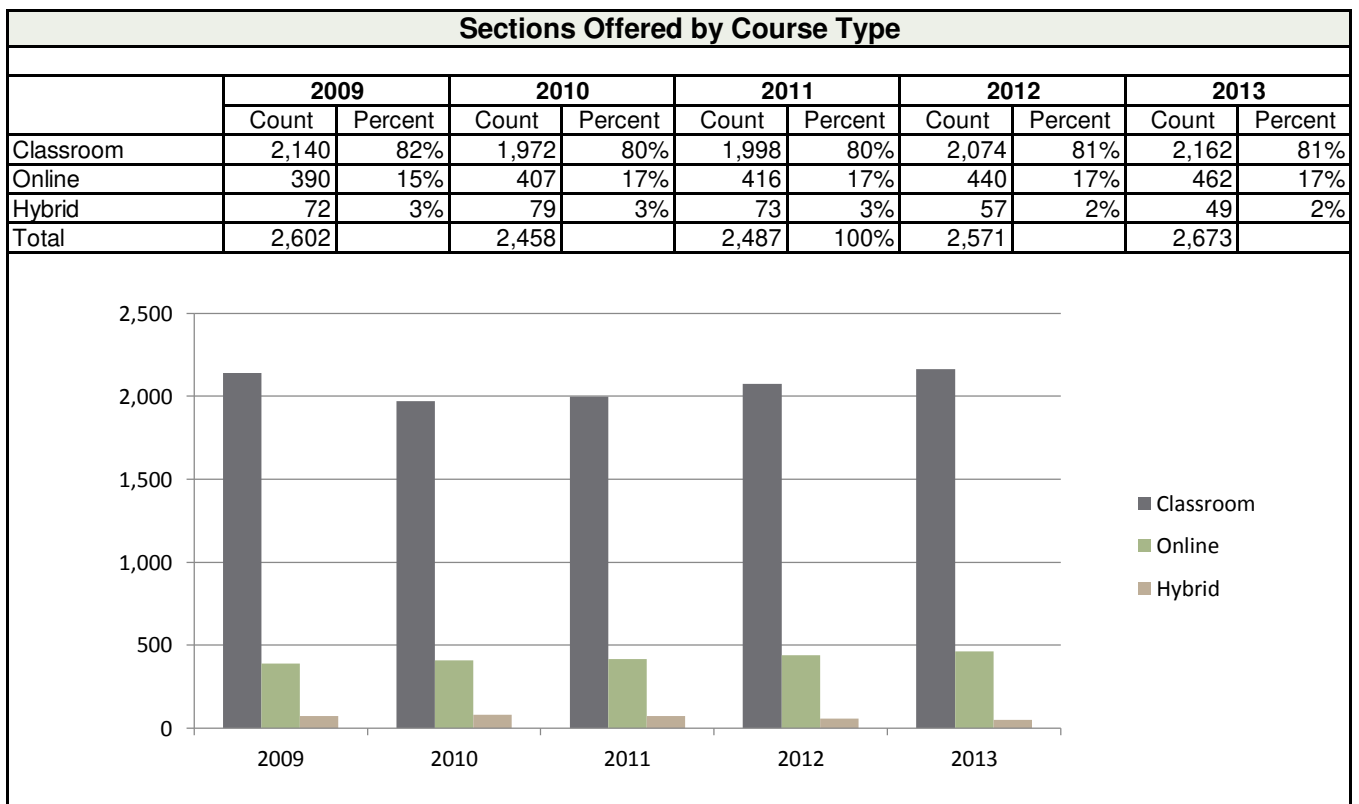

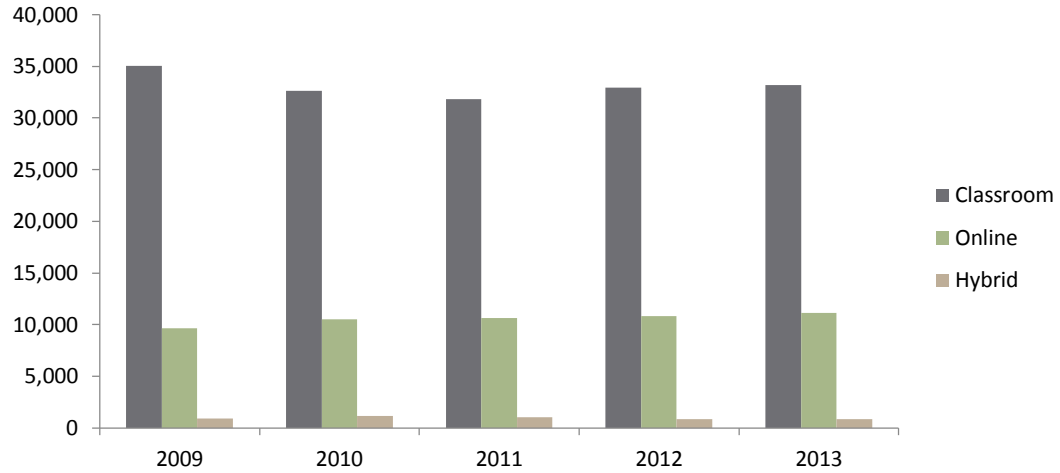

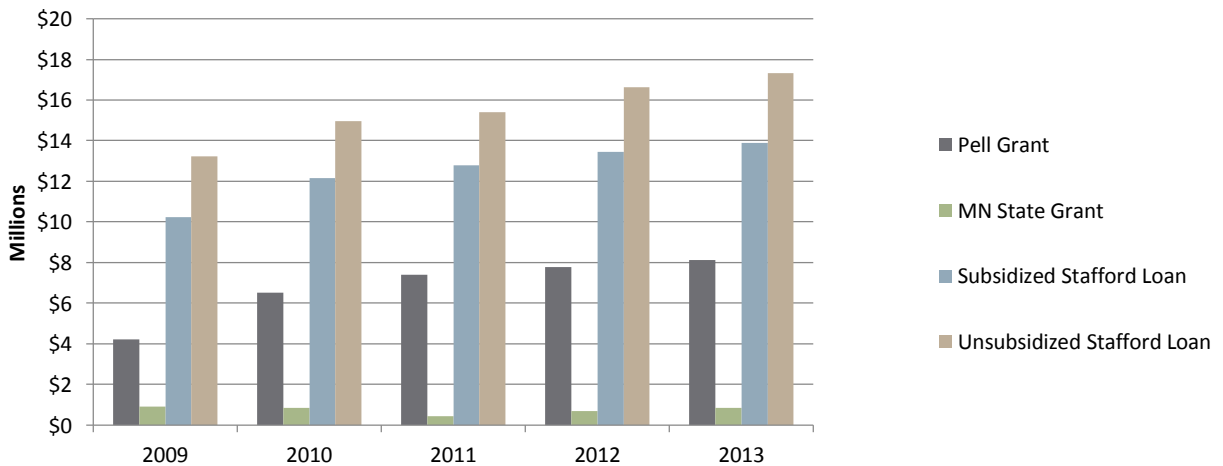

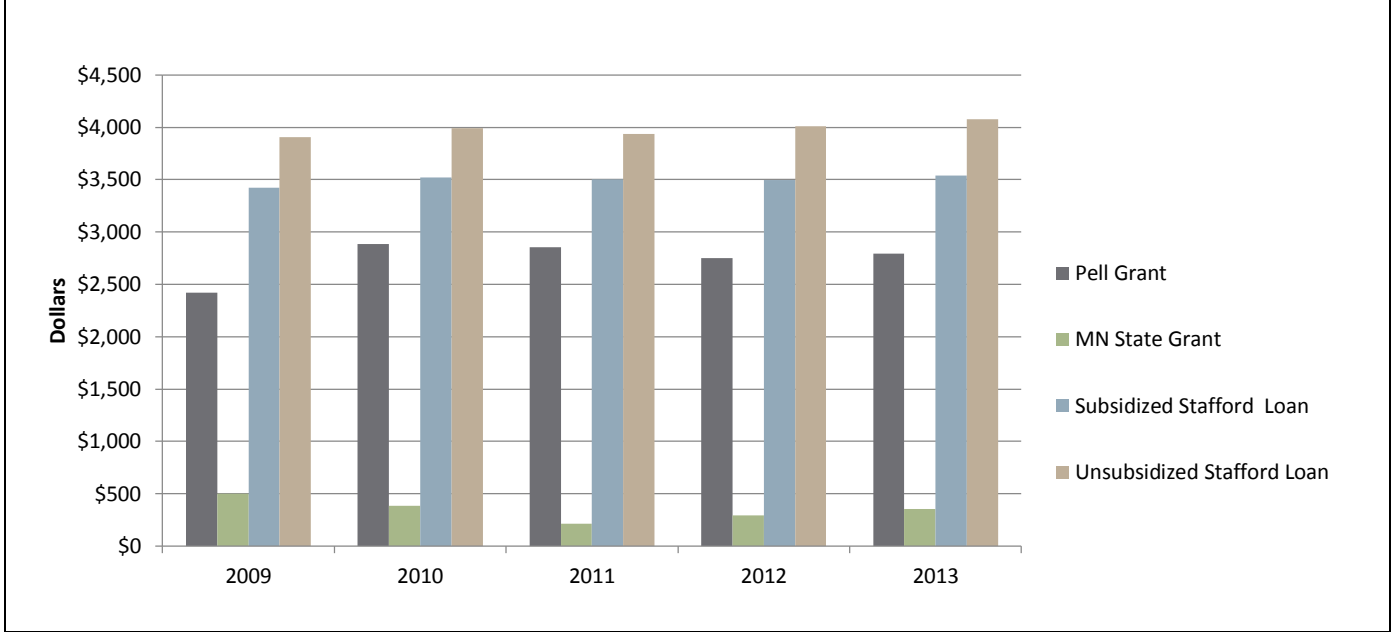

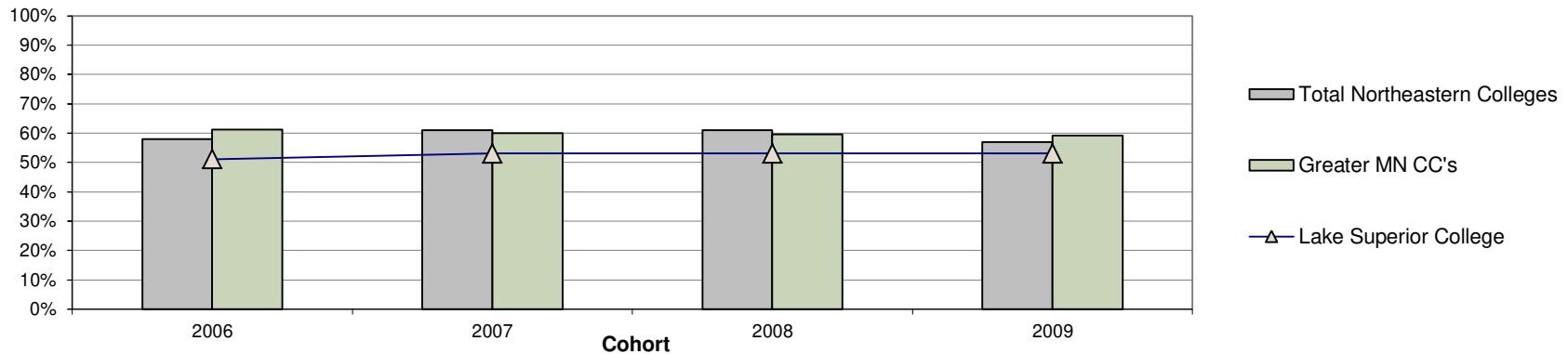

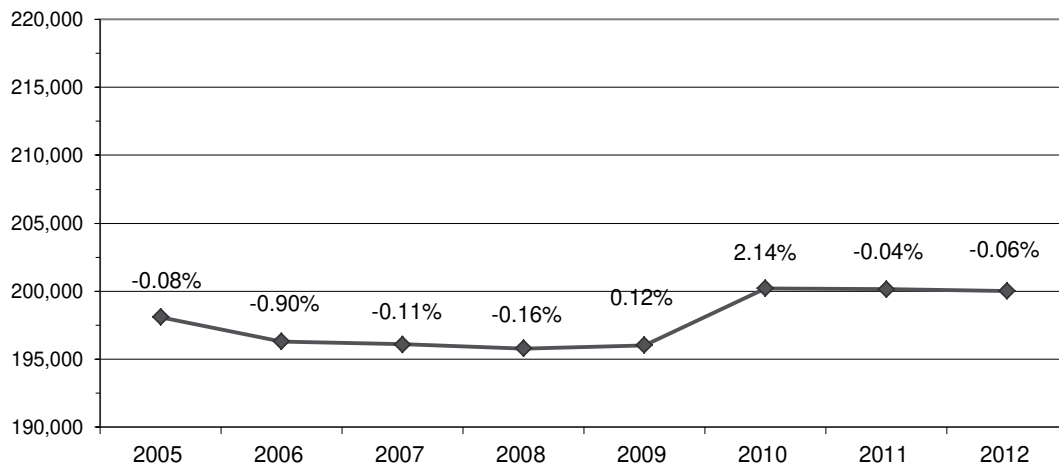

**St. Louis County Population Change from Prior Year - 2004 to 2012**



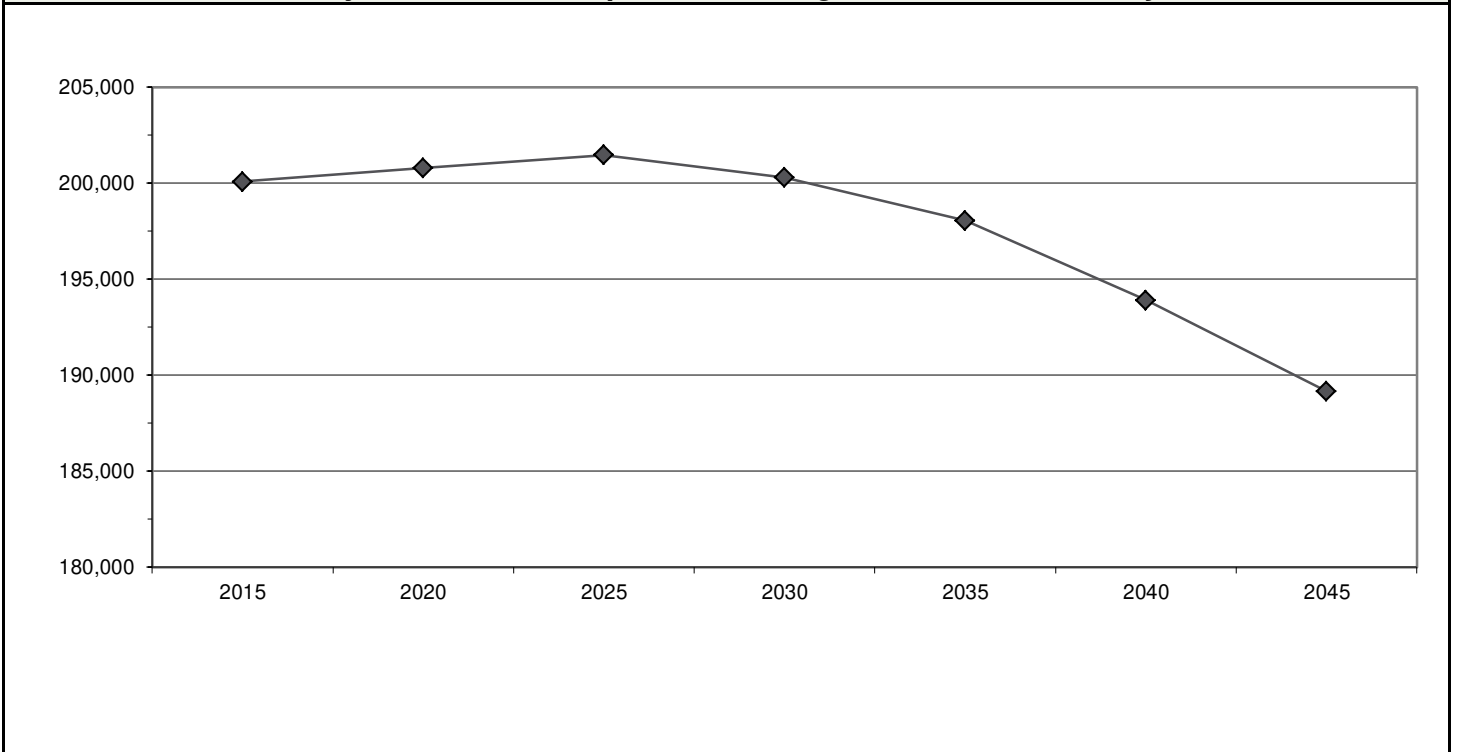

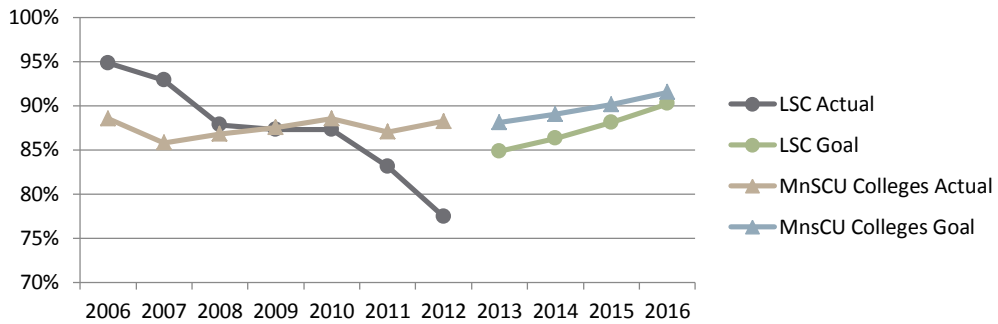

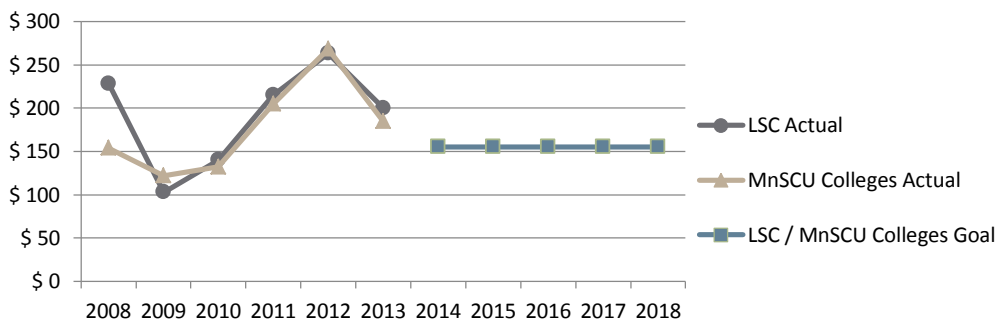
**Licensure Exam Pass Rate**

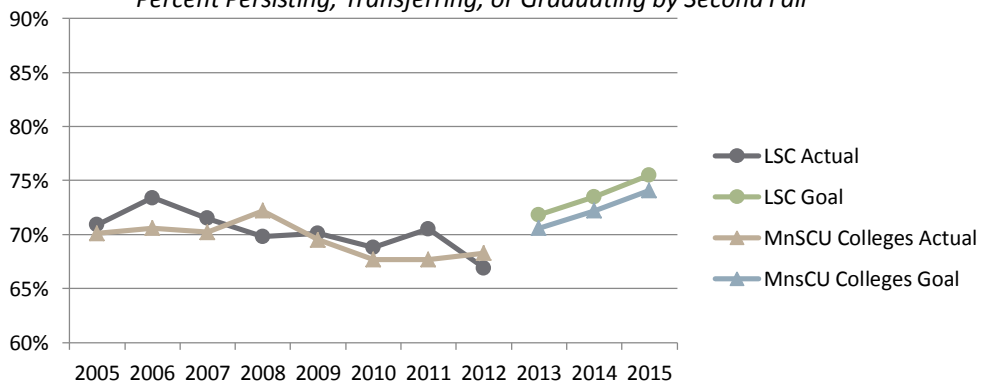

*Change in Tuition and Fees from Previous FY*



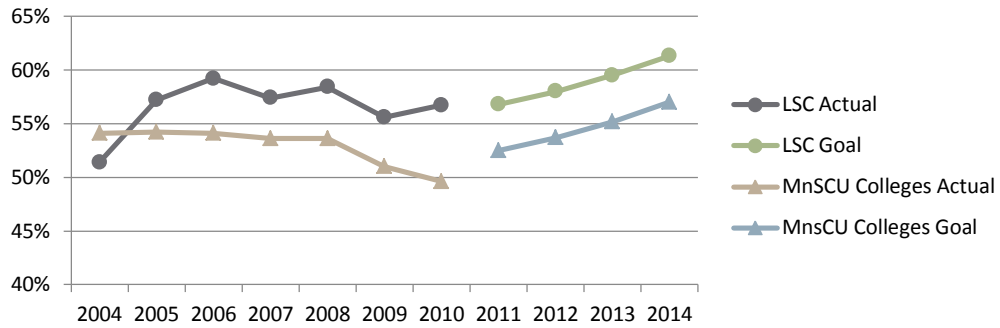

*Percent Persisting, Transferring, or Graduating by Second Fall*



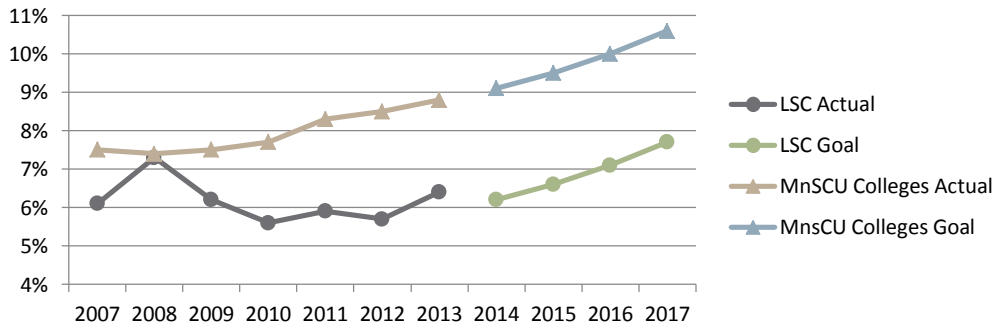

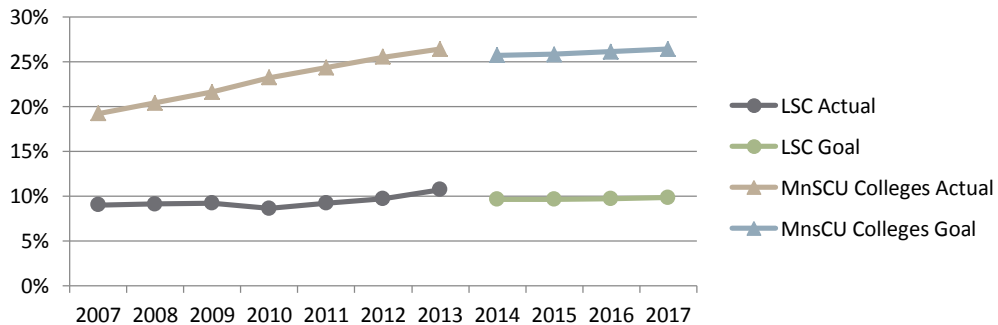

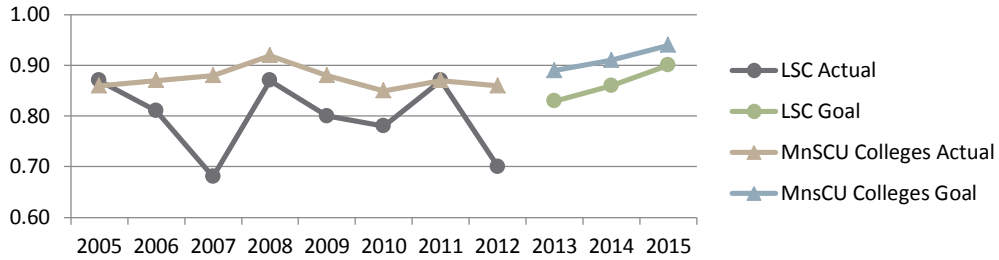

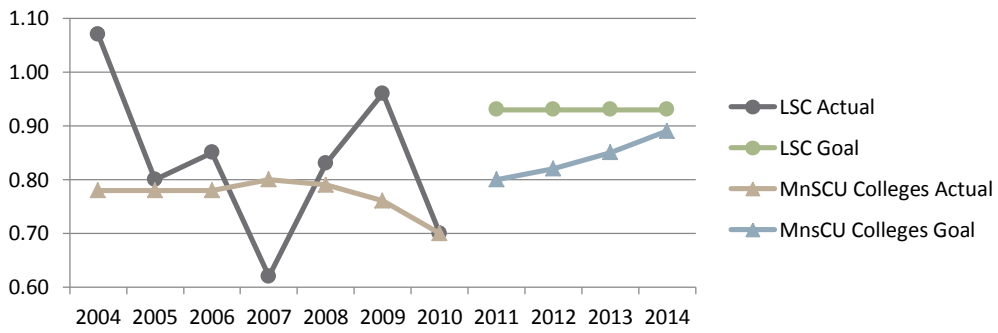

*Ratio: Persistence and Completion Rate for Students of Color to White Students*

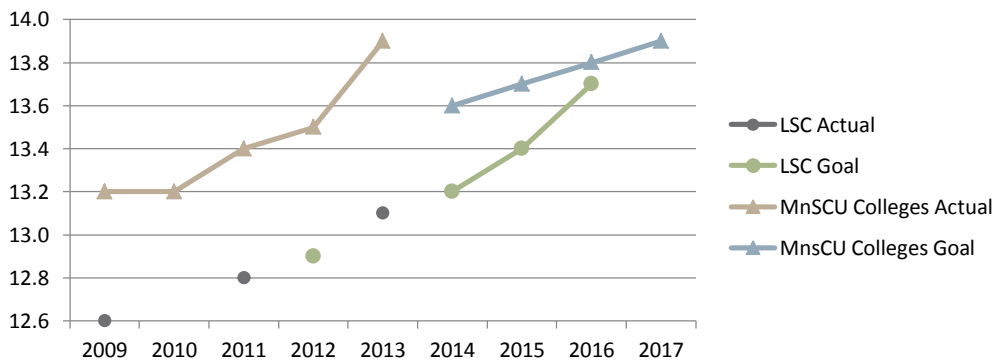


### Completion Rate - Students of Color

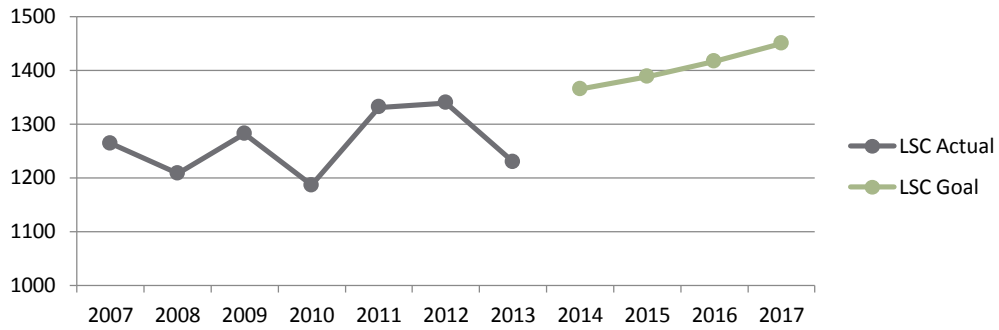




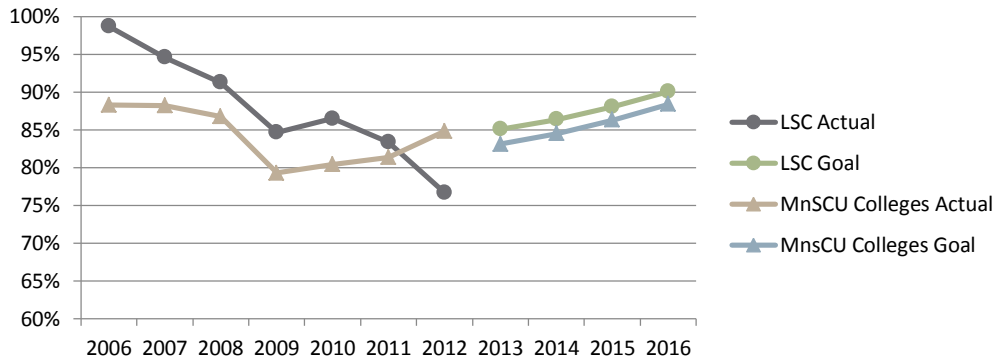

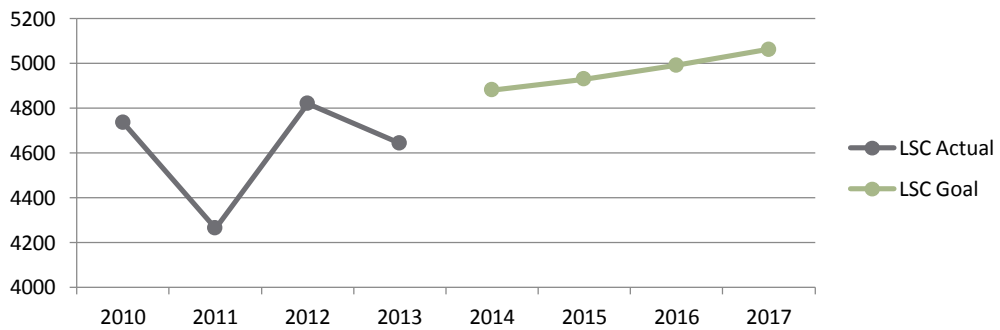

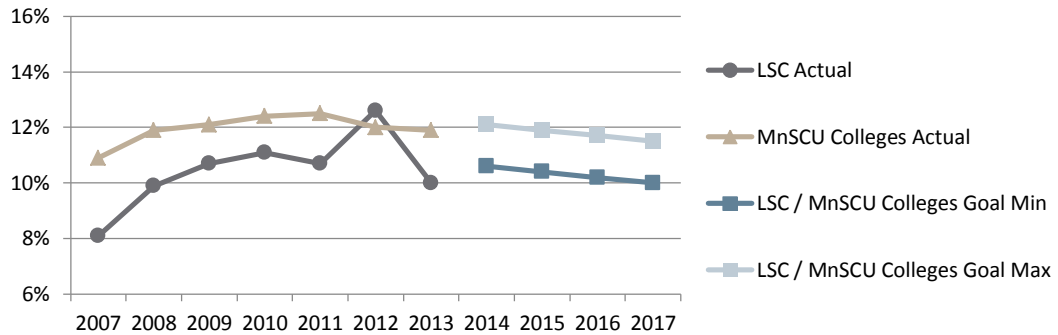

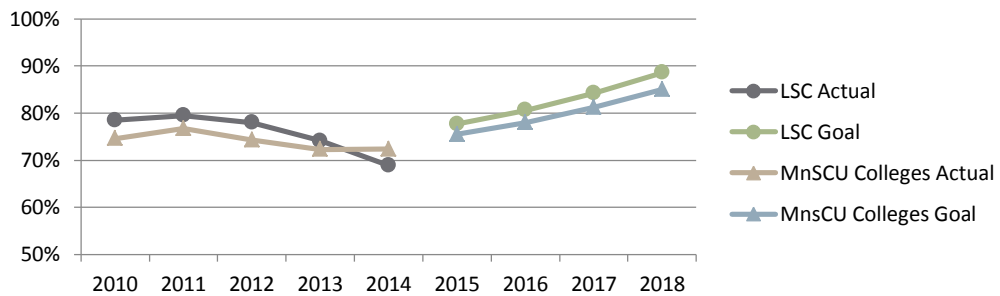

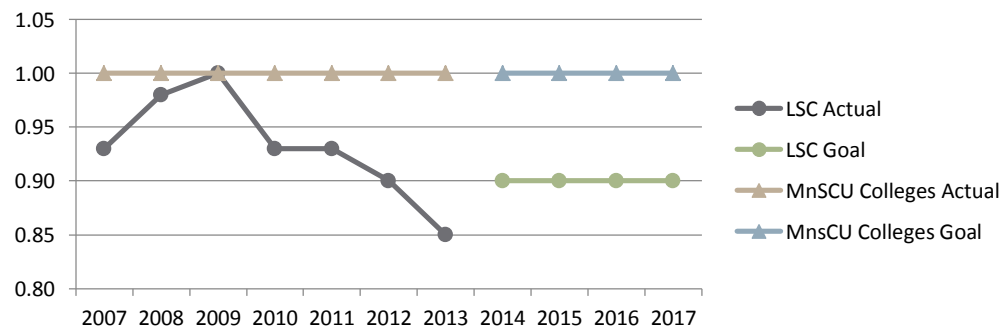

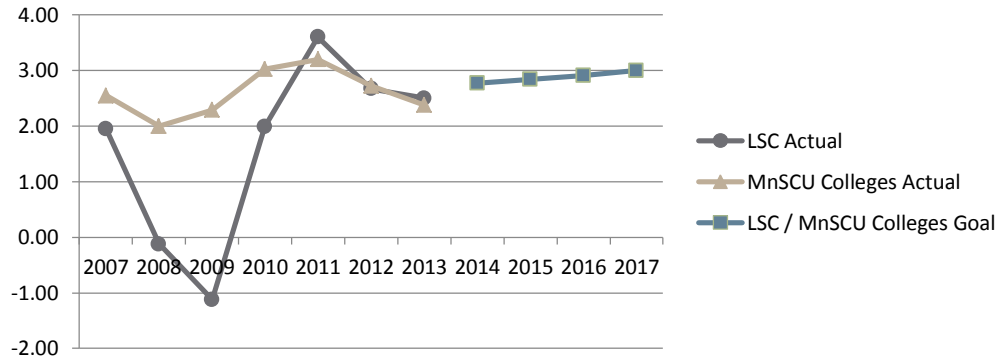


**Instructional Cost per FYE**

### Composite Financial Index



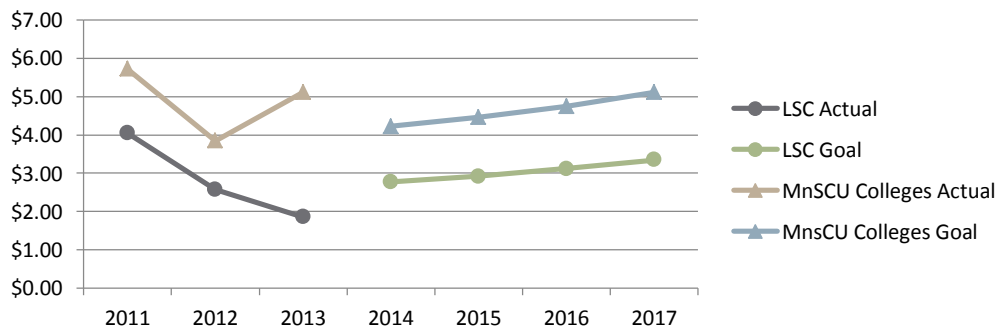

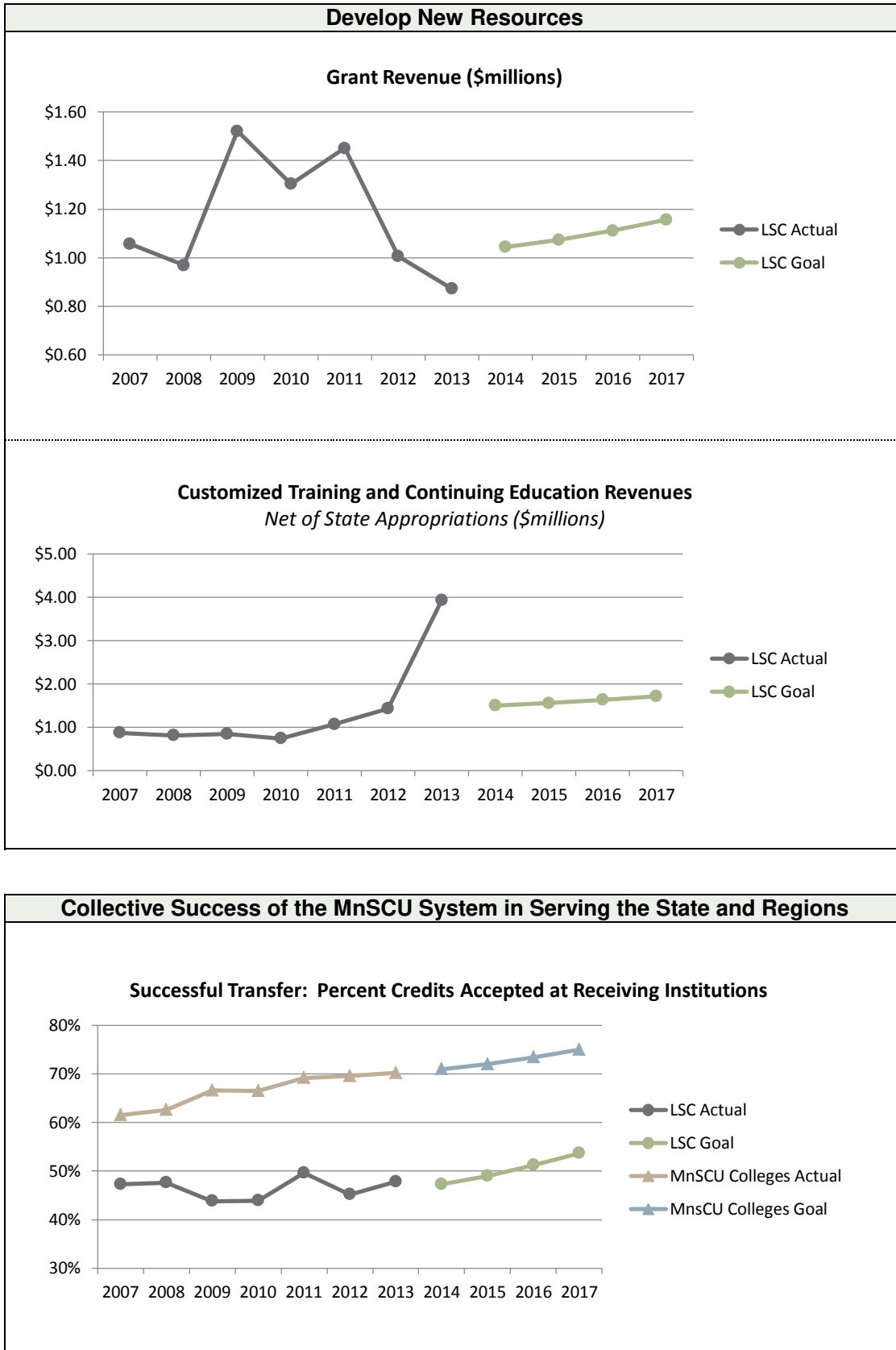

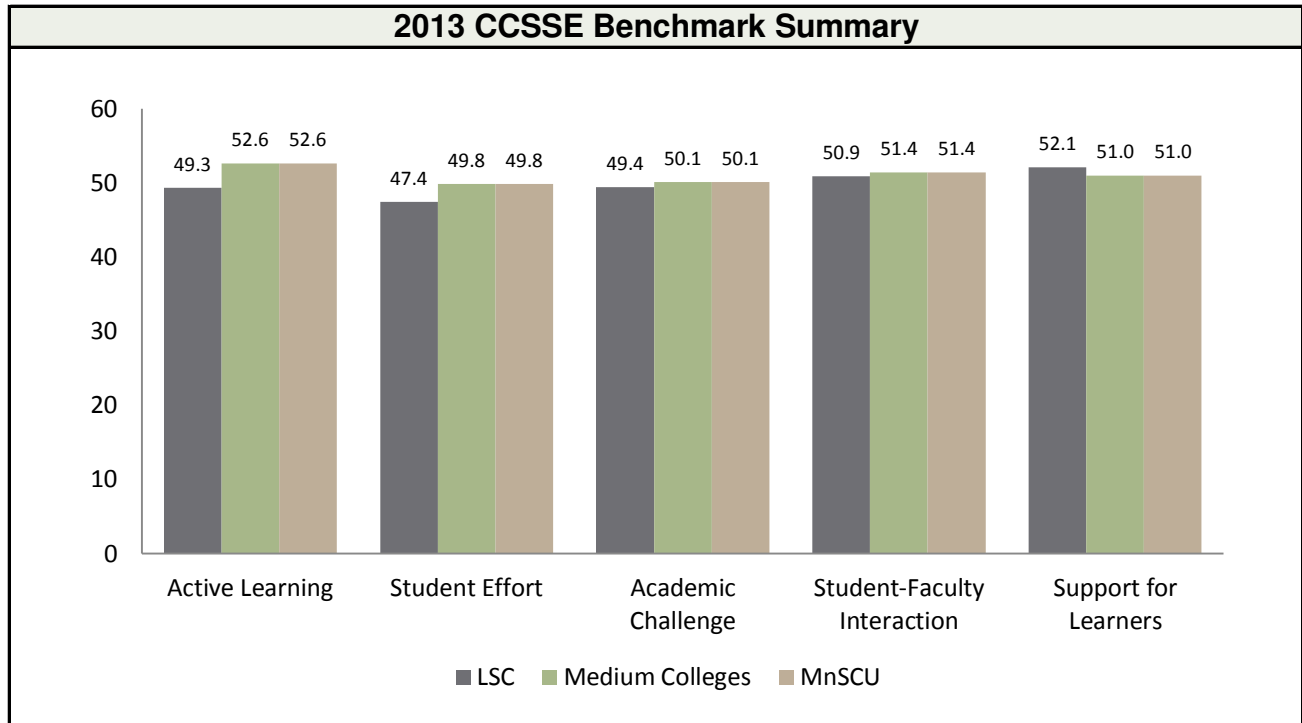




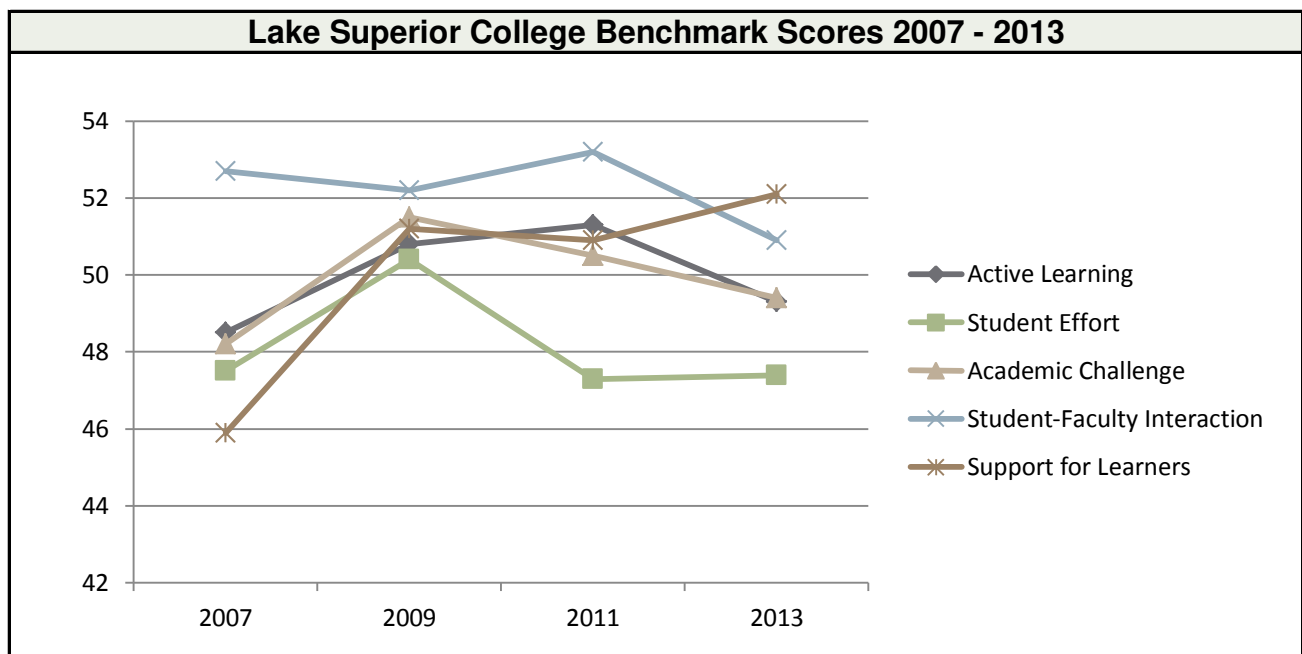

## Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE)

Every other year, the CCSSE Survey is administered to Lake Superior College students. This survey provides information on student engagement, a key indicator of learning and, therefore, of the quality of community colleges. ## Definitions

**Academic Year (AY)** - The academic year begins with the fall term and ends with the following summer term.

**CITS (College in the Schools)** - A Post-Secondary Enrollment Option (see PSEO) wherein high school students receive college credit for courses taught at the high school. This is in contrast to PSEO students who receive credit for courses taught at the college or online by college faculty.

**Credit Student** - A student enrolled in at least one course for credit.

**Customized Training courses** - Contract courses, not open to the public, which are customized to meet specific company training needs. These courses may be credit or non-credit.

**Developmental Course** - A course designed to prepare a student for entry into college level courses.

**First Generation Student - Federal Definition** - A student is considered to be first generation if neither parent earned a bachelor's degree.

**First Generation Student - MN Definition** - A student is considered to be first generation if neither parent received any post-secondary education.

**Fiscal Year (FY)** - The fiscal year begins July 1st and ends June 30th, and is named for the calendar year in which the fiscal year ends. In terms of semesters, the fiscal year begins with the summer term and ends with the following spring semester.

**Freshman** - A student who has earned a cumulative total of fewer than 30 credits.

**FTE (Full-time Equivalent)** - The number of full-time equivalent students, which is calculated by dividing the total student credit hours by the number of credits constituting a full load for the semester (15 credits for undergraduates). FTE is a measure of semester enrollment.

**Full-Time Student** - A student who is registered for 12 or more credits during a semester.

**FYE (Full-year Equivalent)** - The number of full-year equivalent students, which is calculated by dividing the total student credit hours by the number of credits constituting a full load for the year (30 credits for undergraduates). FYE is a measure of annual enrollment.

**Hybrid Course** - A web-enhanced course with limited on-campus meeting times.

**New Student** - A student who first attempted credits at Lake Superior College during the reported fall semester or the preceding summer.

**Non-Credit Student** - A student enrolled in only non-credit courses.

**Non-Traditional Student** - A student who is 25 years of age or older as of September 1st of the reported fiscal year. Non-traditional students are also known as adult learners.

**Non-Resident Alien** - A person who is not a US Citizen and does not have a Green Card. Typically, this refers to International students living temporarily in the US.

**Online Course** - A course that is delivered entirely or predominantly online--also known as an internet course.

**Part-Time Student** - A student who is registered for less than 12 credits during a semester.

**Pell-Eligible** - The student is eligible to receive a federal Pell grant, which is targeted to low-income undergraduates. Pell eligibility is often used as a proxy for low-income.

**PSEO Student** - A high school student receiving college credit through the Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) Program.

**Retention Rate** - The number of students who registered for a semester during the specified term divided by the total number of students in the cohort.

**Returning Student** - A student who has attempted credits at Lake Superior College prior to the reported fall semester or the preceding summer.

**Sophomore** - A student who has earned a cumulative total of 30 or more credits.

**Success Rate** - The sum of the number of students in the entering cohort who have graduated, transferred, or are retained at the college during the specified term divided by the total number of students in the cohort.

**Transfer Rate** - The number of students enrolled at another post-secondary educational institution divided by the number of students in the cohort.

**Underrepresented Student** - A student who meets one or more of the following criteria: (1) Student of color, (2) Low-income, (3) First-Generation student.

**Unduplicated Headcount** - The number of distinct students enrolled over the course of a year. Each student is counted only once, regardless of the number of terms the student is enrolled within the year.
