Happy Friday, May 22, 2020. It has been quite a week! We celebrated the resilient LSC Class of 2020, held a zoom pinning ceremony for graduating nurses, received the news that we could open up limited face to face classes (more details to come next week), began implementing our plans for opening limited student services, heard announcements about big changes in Duluth-area industries, and this morning we announced the new Vice-President for Academic and Student Affairs.

I want to take this opportunity to publicly and sincerely thank Hanna Erpestad for her willingness to step into the interim role as VPASA. This has been an unusually challenging year with many moving parts and changes, compounded by the effects of COVID-19 pandemic on higher education. Her insights on planning, budgets, personnel, and academic programming will certainly enhance the work already begun to ensure that LSC rises to its next level of success.

Despite this last challenging year, we have made great progress and we all should be proud of the efforts everyone has made to keep LSC strong and healthy! Enrollment is steadily trending back up as we are seeing gains in both applications and retention, our students feel supported and are progressing

towards completing their programs, we've also been able to support more students through additional support services such as counseling and the food shelf as well as with increased financial support through the CARES Act and fundraising efforts through the LSC Foundation, and we continue to work closely with and support community/regional partners living up to our role as Our Community's College.
